President: Macky Sall (APR-Yakaar) [since 2 April 2012; elected 2012] The President is elected by direct popular vote for a 7-year term. Electoral System: Two Round (Run-off).

Prime Minister: Abdoul Mbaye [since 3 April 2012] The Prime Minister is appointed by the President.

--Senate (100 Seats) 35 are indirectly elected by members of the National Assembly, local, municipal and regional councils as well as the Superior Council of Senegalese Abroad, 65 members are appointed by the President; members serve 5-year terms.

--National Assembly (150 Seats) Members are elected by direct popular vote through parallel systems - 90 in single or multi-member

constituencies using the first-past-the-post system and 60 by party-list proportional representation; members serve 5-year terms
